



The Hearth

“They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” — Acts 2:42

The Hearth is envisioned as the warm and welcoming heart of the parish community. A place where people gather not merely for coffee, but for connection, belonging, fellowship, and spiritual renewal. Like the hearth of a home, it symbolizes warmth, hospitality, conversation, and rest. Inspired by the early Christian community described in *Acts 2:42*, The Hearth serves as a central gathering place where relationships are formed, faith naturally grows through authentic encounters, and people of all ages are invited into deeper participation in the life of the Church through fellowship, prayer, and shared community.

Emmaus Formation

“Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road?” — Luke 24:32

Emmaus Formation is inspired by the Road to Emmaus story in the Gospel of Luke, where Jesus walked alongside two discouraged disciples, listened to them, taught them, and gradually revealed Himself through relationship and conversation. This ministry focuses on spiritual growth through accompaniment, learning, mentorship, and authentic dialogue. Rather than simply teaching

information, Emmaus Formation seeks to help people journey together in faith so that hearts may be renewed, understanding deepened, and lives transformed through Scripture, community, and encounter with Christ.

Upper Room Prayer

“All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer.” — Acts 1:14

Upper Room Prayer is rooted in the biblical image of the disciples gathered together in prayer before Pentecost, waiting upon the Holy Spirit with openness, unity, and expectation. This ministry exists to strengthen the spiritual life of the parish through communal prayer, intercession, worship, and encouragement. Upper Room Prayer becomes a place where individuals can deepen their relationship with God, support one another spiritually, and seek the guidance, peace, and power of the Holy Spirit for both personal renewal and the mission of the wider parish community.

Wisdom Circle

“Wisdom is with the aged, and understanding in length of days.” — Job 12:12

Wisdom Circle honors the elders of the parish as treasured bearers of faith, life experience, and spiritual wisdom. Inspired by the biblical understanding that wisdom grows through years of lived experience, this ministry recognizes the important role older generations play in mentoring, storytelling, encouragement, and preserving the spiritual heritage of the community. Wisdom Circle creates opportunities for fellowship, belonging, and meaningful connection while celebrating the dignity, value, and ongoing contribution of senior members within parish life.

Companion Hearts

“Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.” — Matthew 5:4

Companion Hearts is a ministry of compassion, friendship, and support for widows and those experiencing seasons of grief, loneliness, or major life transition. Rooted in Christ’s promise of comfort for those who mourn, this ministry reflects the belief that no one should walk through difficult seasons alone. Through shared conversation, prayer, encouragement, and authentic community, Companion Hearts seeks to provide a space of understanding, healing, hope, and companionship where individuals can find comfort, connection, and renewed purpose.

Open Table

“Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers.” — Hebrews 13:2

Open Table embodies the spirit of Christian hospitality by creating welcoming spaces where all people feel invited, valued, and included. Inspired by the biblical call to hospitality and fellowship, this ministry focuses on building relationships through gatherings, meals, conversation, and acts of welcome. Open Table seeks to foster a culture of belonging within the parish where newcomers,

families, visitors, and longtime members alike can encounter warmth, friendship, generosity, and genuine Christian community.

Forge Fellowship

“Iron sharpens iron, and one person sharpens another.” — Proverbs 27:17

Forge Fellowship is a men’s ministry centered on growth, accountability, brotherhood, and spiritual formation. The image of a forge reflects the process of strengthening and shaping through challenge, encouragement, and shared purpose. Inspired by **Proverbs 27:17**, this ministry encourages men to deepen their faith, support one another, and grow as leaders within their families, workplaces, and parish community. Through conversation, prayer, mentorship, and service, Forge Fellowship seeks to cultivate strong, grounded, and Christ-centered men.

Wellspring Women

“The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.” — John 4:14

Wellspring Women is a life-giving community where women are encouraged to grow spiritually, build meaningful friendships, and support one another through every season of life. Inspired by Christ’s words about living water, the image of a wellspring represents renewal, grace, nourishment, and spiritual abundance flowing outward to others. This ministry seeks to create a welcoming environment where women can deepen their faith, discover their gifts, encourage one another, and experience spiritual refreshment while contributing their unique wisdom and strength to the parish community.

Rooted Youth

Rooted Youth is designed to help young people develop deep roots of identity, faith, and purpose in a world that often feels unstable and disconnected. Inspired by the biblical image of being rooted and built up in Christ, this ministry focuses on helping youth build authentic relationships, ask meaningful questions, and encounter Christ in a relevant and supportive community. Rooted Youth seeks to empower young people to grow in confidence, character, leadership, and faith while discovering who God created them to be and building lives firmly grounded in Christ.
